

Queensland Certificate of Education (QCE)

- Certificate that recognises:
- Set amount of learning (20 credit points)
- Set pattern (subjects studied over 4 units)
- Literacy requirement (pass at least 1 unit)
- Numeracy requirement (pass at least 1 unit)
- Small number of students on an individualised learning plan will complete the Queensland Certificate of Individual Achievement (QCIA)

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
Senior Pathways at WVSHS

Units of Study

 General and Applied subjects cover 4 Units of study -Year 11 & 12 work together across the 2 years

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\circUnit 1 - pass = 1 x QCE point
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\circUnit 2 - pass = 1 x QCE point
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\circ Unit 3 and 4 pair - pass = 2 x QCE points
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Must pass the Unit 3 and 4 pair

Units do not follow terms or semesters

Fee for Service

VETiS funding

- Government funded to allow students to get employment stream qualifications while at school
- Range of Certificate I and II courses
- Students can complete one qualification while at school under VETiS
- Other funding sources post school

Fee for Service

• Students pay

SRS and subject fees



- Senior SRS is **\$270** in Year 10
- Subject costs vary mainly excursions
- Students who owe fees cannot choose subjects with extra costs
- See handbook for detailed information on costs

Three Year Senior Phase – 10 to 12

- Subjects studied at the end of year 10 will transfer straight into Year 11
- There is **NO** Subject Selection process going into Year 11
- Students will do a SET Plan review midway in 2025 to confirm pathway
- Students may request a Pathway Review during year 10 or 11
- Students will nominate EOI for the Year 11 programs
- ALL students will need a BYOD



BYOD

- BYOD Laptop onboarded to the school network
- Both pathways all subjects
- No cost to connect to the school network
- Must meet our specs (available on the school website and in the senior subject handbook)
- Windows device is most compatible with DoE
- Good, sturdy case is important

Platform - PC or Mac laptop

Battery Life - Minimum 5 hour+ and above

Hard Drive - 256GB (SSD/EMMC) or above

Frequently Asked Questions

- Be Aware of "Bargain" Laptops / Second Hand Laptops
 - Some cheaper laptops that don't meet the minimum specifications (outlined on page 4) have slow processing power, short battery life and connectivity problems
- Warranty and Insurance Damaged Laptops
 - Accidental Damage Protection (ADP) insurance should be a priority when purchasing devices as devices do get broken. Purchasing a protective sleeve/carry case is recommended to help to protect the laptop from accidental damage like drops

Anti-Virus Protection

• Laptops using Windows 10 are already equipped with Windows Defender and this needs to be enabled.

Microsoft Office Software

• Every state school student across Queensland can download and install multiple copies of the Microsoft Office Professional Plus Suite to their personal home computers and mobile devices for free.

QParents and COMPASS

Is a secure, online portal that is free for all Queensland state schools to use and provides parents with **quick**, **easy access** to their student information including:

- student and attendance details
- report cards and assessment planners
- timetables
- invoices and payment history
- excursion permissions



Elective Subjects

- Students choose four (4) electives
- Must match their senior pathway
- Check pre-requisites
- Subjects are in groups (lines)
- Line **4** electives fall on Monday
- Monday is a **flexible** day



Flexible Day

- Students study 5 of their subjects across 4 days (Tues to Fri)
- Monday is the **flexible day**
- Students choose from the offerings listed must study something in Year 10
- Some courses are 6 months
- Some courses use VETiS funding
- Once students complete a course of study and QCE credits are banked this can be a flexi day
- Options: work experience, other courses, SATs, study at home
- Students who are behind in their studies will be required to attend on Mondays until they catch up

Day structure

- All school subjects/courses have 3 x 70 min lessons per week
- Most courses by external providers are 3 x 70 min lessons on Monday Periods 1 to 3 (Aviation and Electrotechnology are all day)
- Course offsite are all day
- Tuesday to Friday -10 min Care plus Periods 1 to 4
- Wednesday 80 min Extended Care Period 1 then Periods 2 to 4
- Senior sport is P4 Monday training for Gala Days (Interschool sport)

Subject Selections

Students will:

- Select a subject for Maths and English
- For each elective line students choose:
 - First preference
 - \circ 2 reserve choices
- Line 4 on the selection form is Monday
 - If a student wants to do Cert II in Electrotechnology in Year
 11 they will be put in an EOI for 2026
 - This is a VETiS course so they should choose a non VETiS in Year 10





- Based on the **best 5 subjects scaled scores**
 - o 5 General subjects or
 - **o** 4 General and 1 Applied or
 - $\circ~$ 4 General and 1 Cert III +
- General subjects have result out of 100 for Unit 3 and 4 pair
- Applied subjects and Certs are **allocated** a result out of 100
- Scaling done by QTAC can be up or down Eg in 2023 a 76/100 in General Maths went down to 70 and 76/100 in Maths Methods went up to 89

CHOOSE THE FUTURE

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- Based on the cohort results
- Aquatic Practices in 2023 an A = 47 and a B = 23
- Cert III in 2023 was 38.84



Recommended that students study minimum 5 x General subjects

CHOOSE THE FUTURE

- Must study and pass the Unit 3 and 4 pair in an English subject
- For further information see QTAC website
- Scaling is based on the current cohort results

Other Rules

- To study Specialist Maths, you must study Mathematical Methods
- Students cannot study Hospitality Practices and Cert II in Hospitality
- Students cannot study Engineering Skills and Cert II in Engineering Pathways



- Can only put a subject once as first preference
- Cannot choose subjects with extra costs if fees from previous year/s are outstanding

- SET Plan
- \circ Subject selection
- o Talk with your child before
- Must have completed the OS plan
- Bookings through COMPASS
- Interviews in Weeks 3 to 6
- Face to Face or phone interviews available
- Email coming home tomorrow



SET Plan Interview

- No guarantee that all offered subjects will run.
- Bring the Subject Selection Form to the interview.
- Before booking the interview **check**:
 - $_{\odot}$ Have I discussed my SET Plan with my family?
 - $_{\odot}$ Have I followed the rules for my pathway?
 - $_{\odot}$ Do I meet the prerequisites for my subject choices?
 - $_{\odot}$ Are there costs involved in the subjects?
 - Have I completed my OneSchool Education Plan and emailed My Career Profile to my Care teacher?
 - \odot If not done interview cannot go ahead
