Program Selection Guidelines

Students may apply for one Excellence Program from the list above.

Alternatively, students may apply for **two** Excellence Programs, provided that one of the selections is GTEK. This means that if applying for two programs, students must select GTEK in combination with one of the following: Athletics (ACE), Music, Japanese, STEM, or Touch.

How to Apply

To express your interest in applying for an Excellence Program, all applicants are required to complete the standard Excellence Program Application form on page 5 and 6 of this booklet.

When submitting your student's application, you are verifying that the information provided is true and correct, and you support your son or daughter's application for the Excellence Program.

Additional Requirements for GTEK Applications

If you are applying for the GTEK (Academic Excellence) Program, please be aware there is an additional application component.

In addition to the standard Excellence Program application, **GTEK applicants must complete a separate GTEK Application Form** (see page 7). This includes a set of targeted questions designed to help us better understand academic strengths, interests, achievements, and passion for learning.

Please ensure both the standard Excellence Program form and the GTEK form are submitted together to ensure your application is considered.

Application Submission Requirements

For your application to be considered, please ensure the following documents are submitted together:

- Fully completed Excellence Program Application form (including Participation & Achievements details on the reverse side)
- Supporting evidence of achievements, such as copies of certificates demonstrating academic success, commitment to school life, and leadership responsibilities
- Copies (not originals) of the student's last two report cards
- Other academic evidence e.g. NAPLAN

5. Verify and Sign

By submitting the application, you confirm that all information provided is accurate and you support your child's application.
