### **International Space Design Competition**

Over January 13-14, our students competed in the national finals for the Australian Space Design Competition... and won!

Our goal is to get the team to the international finals in the USA in August.

The students have made the finals of this prestigious competition, hosted at the University of Queensland, for the last three years. In 2024, with an experienced team, and the guidance of their teacher Mr Thrum, they paired with Perth Modern School as team Centaurus to design a settlement to capture and mine asteroids in Earth-crossing orbits in the year 2059. After an intense weekend of collaborating to meet the brief, they were announced victorious by a panel of expert engineers and industry professionals. As the first State schools to win the competition in its 16-year history, there was also a sense of accomplishment for public education.

Now we need to get the team to Orlando and the Kennedy Space Centre in the USA to compete in the International Space Design Competition.

Help the national champions become world champions. I am requesting that the School Council endorses the team of current and alumni students to seek sponsorship and support to get to the USA in July this year.
